The meeting was called to order by President Perry at 5:30 p.m.

INTRODUCTION OF GUESTS: None

PUBLIC COMMENTS: None

APPROVAL O F THE AGENDA:

Director Lowe moved to approve the agenda; Director Martini seconded the motion; the motion passed unanimously.

<u>DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION TO APPROVE THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS THROUGH</u> FEBRUARY 29, 2020:

Exhibits Coordinator Borck presented the Financial Statements. **Director Goyne moved to approve the Financial Statements through February 29, 2020; Director Lowe seconded the motion; the motion passed unanimously.**

APPROVAL OF ITEM 1-2 ON THE CONSENT AGENDA:

Director Crane moved to approve items 1-2 on the consent agenda; Director Goyne seconded the motion; the motion passed unanimously.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT:

President Perry indicated that he hoped they'd be able to decide at this meeting when the grand tasting will occur in 2021. There has been no further direction from Sonoma County Fair regarding Harvest Fair's involvement in the Saralee Barn. The Count Fair is currently waiting for a proposal from the Sonoma County Farm Bureau.

DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION: COMMITTEE REPORTS

Ag Outreach: The Ag Outreach committee has requested that the vendor application be shared with them so that they can seek additional opportunities for inside the tasting pavilion. Potential partners such as SRJC and the small engine club are being explored.

Beer and Wine: Director Lowe presented a list of potential wine classes. He suggested price breaks be added to the Pinot Noir, Zinfandel/Primitivo, Cabernet Sauvignon and Red Blend varietals as well as an additional rose class based on residual sugar. Director Lowe moved to approve the addition of the five classes, Director Goyne seconded the motion; the motion passed unanimously.

Director Lowe also reported that Buena Vista Winery has confirmed they are willing to host the Tuesday judges dinner. He thanked Director Crane for making contact with Buena Vista.

Awards Night: Board reviewed the two menu options provided by Park Avenue Catering. Director Crane moved to accept option A, Director Tesconi seconded the motion, the motion passed unanimously.

Director Matthias reported that Comcast has expressed an interest in doing the video. When she knows more she will report back to the board. Comcast may be able to create the video, but not provide the \$10,000 sponsorship. Director Matthias reported that The Engine is Red may also been an option for sponsorship.

Admin/Adhoc: No Report

DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION: LOCATION AND DATES OF 2021 HARVEST FAIR

The committee discussed the potential time of year and location that would be best suited for the model they would like to use for the 2021 Harvest Fair. **Director Goyne moved to hold the 2021 Harvest Fair Grand Tasting in October, Director Matthias seconded the motion; the motion passed.** It was requested that the contract with Sonoma County Fair be placed as a future agenda item.

<u>DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION: HARVEST FAIR INVOLVEMENT DURING SONOMA</u> COUNTY FAIR

Director Tesconi is working with CEO Bartling to put together a wine grotto during fair that will be run by AVA'S. It is not yet confirmed the amount of interest or to what capacity they will be able to be involved. The goal is to potentially advertise and market the Harvest fair and encourage the attendance during the fall.

DISCUSSION AND POSSIBLE ACTION: SONOMA COUNTY VINTNER'S SEAT ON THE BOARD

President Perry will reach out to the Vintners regarding the funding that is owed to the Harvest Fair from past TOT funds.
